Don't Forget - Next Meeting





The membership list (both on-line and paper versions) have been synchronized so information should be identical in both. The members cars listed have been updated. However, if you see something that should be changed, let the editor know.




We have developed a website page that contains the work that Melinda has been generating with the Remember When... format. The

Cruise for Crosslines



The concept behind Crosslines originated when a small interdenominational group saw the need for churches to get involved with finding solutions to poverty. At the same time, the Council of Churches of the Ozarks was established with a mission to "serve God's people in need" through a food pantry. This partnership has provided Crosslines with the strong

volunteer base needed to assist distressed families and individuals in the community with help with groceries and other necessary items. The Council of Churches has since expanded to support the community through a variety of services, and Crosslines has thrived in the partnership.

Crosslines opened on March 24, 1969 at the Locust and Lyon Community Center. In the beginning, five

basis. At the start, Crosslines volunteers served four or five families a day; in 1993 that number rose to about 73 families a day; now in 2016 Crosslines is serving approximately 100 families a day, five days a week. For 46 years, Crosslines has been providing emergency food assistance to families in Greene County and continues to expand the service footprint beyond pantry and into the community and area schools through the mobile distribution.

I asked Crosslines for statistical information about the show and I received this encouraging response from Jon Hallgren, program Coordinator.

"Hi Dave! Thanks for taking part in the event! The weather turned out beautiful! We had 60 cars registered with about 150 people. We also made \$ 1,286.00 towards toys for Crosslines this year. The 50/50 pot winner was so nice to donate his half back to Crosslines. This event really helps out since we need about 15,000 toys each year for our toy store at the fairgrounds. Thanks for everything!"


<u>Texarkana Fall Foliage Tour (Melinda's Travelogue)</u>

Highlights from 1957...

The 1957 Chevy is still regarded by many as the definitive '50s car. There were seven engine choices, including no fewer than five 283 v-8's with 185 up to 283 bhp. The last was courtesy of "Ramjet" fuel injection, a new option that found few takers among Chevy passenger-car buyers at \$500, but enabled the division to claim "1 hp per cu. in." Yet '57s were fast even without "fuelie" power. A Bel Air Sport Sedan with four-barrel 270-bhp engine could do 0-60 in 9.9 seconds, the quarter-mile in 17.5, and over 110 mph flat out. (Information adapted from The Encyclopedia of American Cars.)
