As part of a Fan Appreciation Day Celebration, nine members of the Classic Chevy Club attended performances by Jimmy Osmond, Charlie Green, and the Voices of Glory. Jimmy was the youngest of the Osmond family. The Osmonds got their start on the Andy Williams Show. Jimmy was three years old at the time. He now owns the Moon River Theater. He has been in Branson for 27 years. The show was entertaining with antidotal stories and videos and photographs.

Voices of Glory is a group of siblings who are on a mission to change the world through their unique style of singing, tight harmonies, and inspirational message. Michael, Avery, and Nadia Cole, started singing together in 2005 after their mother, Felicia, was in a car collision with a drunk driver, placing her in a coma. Day after day, the trio would serenade their mother by her bed, until 8 months later, Felicia came out of her coma. After this experience, the group began to travel to nursing homes and hospitals in an effort to bring hope to other patients and their families, and they adopted the name "Voices of Glory".

In 2009, the group achieved national recognition when they made it to the Top 5 on the NBC hit show "America's Got Talent". After that, opportunities were plentiful. The group has appeared on all major television networks with special guest appearances on Fox News, the Jim Bakker Show, and the Bobby Jones Gospel Hour. They were personally selected by Mr. Andy Williams to be in his annual Christmas Show.

They have been featured in People Magazine, Jet Magazine, MTV Chatroom, and USA Today. They have performed in venues all across America including the Grand Ole' Opry Entertainment Complex, American Airlines Arena, Madison Square Garden, Music City USA Auditorium, and the Apollo Center. Additionally, they have been featured artists at an international concert in Germany and were requested to perform in the world renown "Drums of the World Festival" in South Africa.

After touring for several years, in 2012, the Voices of Glory found a home for their show, "AYO", in Branson, MO, at the Hughes Brothers Theatre. In Branson, the group has had phenomenal success, piling on accolades such as "Best Matinee Show" and "Young Female Entertainer of the Year Award" (Nadia) along with a slew of other nominations. Their time in Branson has allowed them to record multiple albums as well as author their autobiography, Higher Than Me. "We have been given a unique opportunity to deliver a message of hope through our music," says oldest brother

Michael Cole, "and it is a challenge that we do not take likely." Voices of Glory is already an incredibly accomplished group of musicians, and this is only the beginning of the great things that will come from these talented, young siblings!

Charlie Green is an English singer from Droitwich, Worcestershire, England. Green is best known for appearing on Britain's Got Talent in 2008.

Later in the day we arrived at River Bend Casino in Wyandotte, OK. Everyone got checked in and found a warm place to hang out with participants from Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Texas. We broke up in smaller groups and found either the deli or the Twin Bridges Restaurant to dine. Some wandered into the casino.

The next day was cold and breezy to say the least. It had been a long time since any of the classic Chevys had frost on their windows. Breakfast was served, drivers meeting held, and we then traveled west from River Bend Casino about a half a mile and made a right turn. Several drivers missed the turn and had to make a U-turn and play catch-up. I won’t say who the drivers were. Usually, the missed turns occur later in the tour, so we got those turns out of the way in the first 5 minutes.

We traveled to Miami, OK, on to Baxter Springs, KS, and then paused on the square in Carthage, MO. Along the way the participants engaged in Scavenger Hunt (things to look for along the way).

The contingent scattered for lunch. One of our members supposedly had an ice cream treat and returned later for another one. Again, I won’t divulge who the double dipper(s) were. And then we were back on the road to River Bend.

A little history lesson about Carthage

Carthage is a city in Jasper County. The population was 14,378 at the 2010 census. It is the county seat of Jasper County and is nicknamed "America's Maple Leaf City."

Jasper County was formed in 1841. Carthage was chosen as the county seat, the area cleared and the town platted in 1842. The city was named after ancient Carthage. By the time of the American Civil War, there were over 500 residents, a brick and stone courthouse, and several businesses.

The area grew rapidly following the Civil War. The Missouri Western Railroad arrived in 1872. Town residents started a foundry, furniture factory, woolen and grain mills, a plow works and numerous liverys and other businesses. Leggett & Platt, now a Fortune 500 company still based in Carthage, was founded in 1883. Nearby lead mines and limestone quarries also contributed significant wealth and Carthage became one of the most prosperous towns in the area. Residents poured their money into ornate Victorian-style homes, many of which are now part of the Carthage South District, which was named to the National Register of Historic Places in 1982. The Jasper County Courthouse, also on the National Register of Historic Places, was built of Carthage stone in 1894-95. There is a mural inside the courthouse depicting the history of Jasper County. Growth in Carthage can be documented through Sanborn Maps, many of which are available online.

Numerous local buildings, in addition to the courthouse, were built in the late 19th and early 20th century out of stone from local quarries. The limestone is hard enough to be polished into "Carthage marble" and was used in both the interior and exterior of the state capitol building in Jefferson City, Missouri. The quarries known today as the Carthage Underground, a commercial space that utilizes but a small portion of the extensive uncharted quarries nearby.

We had a Springfield Car Club dinner at the casino and then on to the host sponsored celebration of 25 years of Fall Foliage Tours. The celebration included refreshments, reminiscing, awards and certificates, and a gift exchange. Gifts ranged from the practical like booster cables, car detailing supplies, and dish towels, to Christmas themed items like mugs, decorations, and totes.

The host sponsor thanked all those who attended and those that helped put the event together. They had an open reminiscing segment. Our Larry Fortner spoke at this time. Certificates of appreciation were given to Larry Fortner (Seasoned Traveler) and Melinda and Jess Owen for first time participants.

Donna & Jack Wernet won the scavenger hunt.

Each of the clubs that were represented were presented a thumb drive with a video of photographs from the tour that they had sponsored in the past. A drawing was held and Norma & Dennis Taube and Yvonna Davis & Dave Walters received one of the table decorations (25 Year Bow Tie Stand and Chevrolet Decal). See photo gallery.

Jefferson, TX

Jefferson is a city in Marion County in northeastern Texas, United States. The population was 2,099 at the 2010 census. It is the county seat of Marion County, Texas, and is situated in East Texas.

The city is a tourism destination, with popular attractions including: Jay Gould's Railroad car, the Sterne Fountain, Jefferson Carnegie Library, Excelsior House, the House of the Four Seasons, and the bayous formed by Big Cypress Bayou located in and around the city.

Early records indicate that Jefferson was founded around 1841 on land ceded from the Caddo Indians. At that time, a log jam more than 100 miles long existed on the Red River north of present Natchitoches, Louisiana. The Indians said that this log jam, known as the Great Red River Raft, had always existed.

The Red River Raft (or Great Raft) acted as a dam on the river and raised the level of Caddo Lake and the Red River several feet. This rise of Caddo Lake and the corresponding rise in the Big Cypress Bayou at Jefferson permitted commercial riverboat travel to Jefferson from ports such as St. Louis and New Orleans via the Mississippi and Red Rivers.

Jefferson was one of the most important ports in Texas between 1845 and 1872. The town reached its peak population just a few years after the Civil War and is reported to have exceeded 30,000. During this time, Jefferson was the sixth-largest town in Texas.

There were attempts over the years to remove the raft and permit the normal flow of the Red River, but these attempts were unsuccessful until the discovery of nitroglycerin. In 1873, using nitroglycerin, the Army Corps of Engineers was finally able to clear the raft from the Red River. This lowered the level of Caddo Lake and Big Cypress to the extent that riverboat traffic to Jefferson was no longer commercially feasible. At the peak of river traffic, Jefferson had a population of over 7,000. A few years later, it had dropped to a little over 3,000.

One of the legends related to Jefferson referred to Jay Gould, the railroad magnate. The legend goes that Gould wanted to bring his railroad through Jefferson but the town leaders refused because they had the river traffic. Gould said that "grass would grow in the streets" without the railroad. Gould credited with supporting the removal of the Red River Raft and the subsequent decline of Jefferson as a river port. Much of this tale is fiction. Townspeople obtained Gould's railcar and it is displayed as a tourist attraction in downtown Jefferson.

Marshall, TX

Marshall is a city in and the county seat of Harrison County in northeastern Texas in the United States. Marshall is a major cultural and educational center in East Texas and the tri-state area. At the 2010 census, the population of Marshall was 23,523. The population of the Marshall Micropolitan Area, comprising all of Harrison County, was 65,631 in 2010.

Marshall was a political and production center of the Confederacy during the Civil War. Later it was a major railroad center of the T&P Railroad from the late 19th century until the mid-20th century. Activists in the city's large African American population worked to create social change through the Civil Rights Movement, with considerable support from the historically black colleges and universities here. The city is known for holding one of the largest light festivals in the United States, the "Wonderland of Lights". It identifies as the self-proclaimed "Pottery Capital of the World", for its sizable pottery industry.

Marshall is referred to by various nicknames: the "Cultural Capital of East Texas", the "Gateway of Texas", the "Athens of Texas", the "City of Seven Flags", and "Center Stage", a branding slogan adopted by the Marshall Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Mt Pleasant, TX

Mount Pleasant is the county seat and largest city of Titus County, in the U.S. state of Texas. As of the 2010 census, Mount Pleasant's population was 15,564; it is situated in Northeast Texas.

Mount Pleasant was founded May 11, 1848, to serve as county seat for Titus County, which was created by a legislative act on May 11, 1846. Until after the Civil War, Titus County also included the territory of present-day Franklin and Morris Counties. High waters along the creeks and the Sulphur River often halted travel in the early years.

In the 21st century, Titus County comprises the Mount Pleasant Micropolitan Statistical Area, named for the county seat.

There are a lot of beautiful Aviation museums across the country that have their own particular mission. Mid America Flight Museum is based in Mt. Pleasant Texas (KOSA). Our museum differentiates itself from many other museums in that the great majority of the airplanes in the museum fly on a regular bases, and that ongoing projects are being restored to fly!

Texarkana, AR

Texarkana is a city in Arkansas and the county seat of Miller County. The city is located across the state line from its twin city, Texarkana, Texas. The city was founded at a railroad intersection on December 8, 1873, and was incorporated in Arkansas on August 10, 1880. Texarkana (together with its Texas counterpart) is the principal city of the Texarkana metropolitan area, which is ranked 274th in terms of population in the United States with 150,098 in 2016 according to the United States Census Bureau.

Texarkana, TX

Texarkana is a city in eastern Texas, with a twin city across the border in Arkansas. Spring Lake Park has playgrounds, walking trails and sports fields. The 19th-century Ace of Clubs House, now a museum, is shaped like a playing-card club. Interactive children’s exhibits at Discovery Place include a sound wall and general store. Built in 1924, the Italian Renaissance–style Perot Theatre hosts musicals and concerts

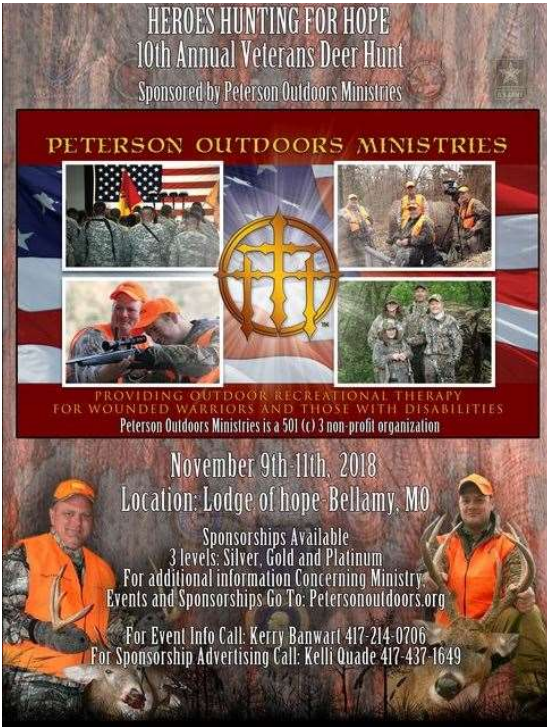
