

Birth of the Mother Road

U.S. 66, also known as Route 66, the Mother Road, the Main Street of America, and the Will Rogers Highway, was officially named "U.S. 66," via telegram at a meeting of highway officials in Springfield, Missouri on April 30, 1926. Calvin Coolidge was President, Prohibition was still in full swing, motion pictures were a year away from becoming "talkies," and Henry Ford had just lowered the price of the automobile. The stage was set for what would become not only the country's first cross-country highway, but an enduring piece of Americana that travelers from around the world still yearn to experience. In 1992, on the Mother Road's 66th anniversary, the Route 66 Association of Missouri designated Springfield as the official Birthplace of Route 66 with a placard, now located on the east side of Park Central Square.



Birthplace of Route 66 Festival

Taking place in and around the Park Central Square area of downtown Springfield, there are sure to be cars and trucks that will enthuse everyone."

Participation, attendance, and parade numbers were very strong. Around 650 cars registered, 75,000 people in attendance, and nearly 700 vehicles in the parade.

Next year's festival is scheduled for August 8-9, 2020

2019 John T. Woodruff Awards Presentation: Birthplace of Route 66 Festival founder David Eslick (and Classic Chevy Club member) presented the John T. Woodruff Award to two of Springfield's most enthusiastic Route 66 supporters Saturday in Park Central Square during the 9th annual Birthplace of Route 66 Festival.

Guy Mace has the Route 66 Car Museum at 1634 College Street on the original Route 66 through Springfield in a building that housed his company, Turblex. Mace has long supported Route 66.

About the Woodruff Award: The John T. Woodruff Award is named for the Springfield businessman and entrepreneur who was one of three men that, in 1926, helped number the new east-to-west highway from Chicago, Illinois to Los Angeles, California.

A telegram sent from Woodruff's Colonial Hotel asking that the numbers for the new highway be named 66, making Springfield, Missouri the Birthplace of Route 66.

Dave Eslick's Public Thank You in News-Leader

Thank you for the best Birthplace of Route 66 Festival ever This year's numbers say it all. As the founder of the first Birthplace of Route 66 Festival in Springfield, Missouri in 2011, with 100 cars and 1,000 people, I don't think we could have imagined that we would reach these numbers in 9 short years. This is the biggest event in Springfield and on Route 66 in Missouri!

The attendance figure of 65,000 people, the Friday night parade with 699 cars, with 5,000 people along the route, the car show had 642 cars from 14 states. (Long Distance Award went to Wilson Peterson, 1,838 miles, from Auburn, California). The Route 66 6.6K run drew 140 runners. The Gypsy Poker Run had 322 motorcycles and raised \$11,000 for the Combat Veterans Motorcycles Association. Hundreds of motorcycles lined up on

Jefferson Avenue and throughout the Aaron Sachs and Associates "Motorcycle Village." Hundreds gathered on the square to hear the Branson entertainers on the Chevy Dealers of the Ozarks, Branson Experience Stage. A new event, Women's World, in the Shrine Mosque recorded 2,500 visitors. The History Museum on the Square had over 500 visitors.

The Birthplace festival was started to honor John T. Woodruff, with an award each year to someone that promotes Route 66. This year's recipients were Guy Mace, owner of the Route 66 Car Museum, and Kirk E. Wheeler, owner of Mother Road Motorcycles.

I attribute the festival's growth to our partners: Aaron Sachs and Associates for the great music, along with KY3 with all the great promotions to celebrate their 66th year. The city of Springfield and the West Central Neighborhood Alliance.

I just say thanks and see you next year!

<u>SEPTEMBER 7 – ROCKBRIDGE LUNCH</u> AND ASSUMPTION ABBEY TOUR

Club members will meet at the Ozark Walmart parking lot and leave 10:00 am. We will caravan to the Rockbridge Rainbow Trout Ranch for lunch. Please plan to drive your classic if at all possible. There are no planned stops for gas or snacks.

There are several old buildings that can be viewed near the restaurant as well as a small boutique.

Luncheon reservations are scheduled for 12:00 noon. After lunch we plan leave the restaurant at 1:30 pm and will caravan to the Assumption Abbey (Trappist monastery) where a tour is arranged for the Abbey grounds at 2:15 pm. There is no cost for the tour but a donation to the Abbey is always appreciated. There is no dress code at the Abbey. They only ask that clothing is not provocative. Jeans and t-shirts are fine. After the tour we will be able to visit the

gift shop where the world-famous fruit cakes will be for sale at a cost of \$27.00, no tax. We have been asked to have small bills as they will not be



able to make change for big bills such as a \$100.00. They can also accept credit cards. The road is paved into the Abbey and there is adequate parking. There are flyers for both events in the flyer section below.

About the Trappists: Trappist, formally member of the Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance (O.C.S.O.), member of the reformed branch of Roman Catholic Cistercians founded by Armand-Jean Le Bouthillier de Rancé in France in 1662. The order follows the Rule of St. Benedict and consist of both monks and nuns; the nuns are known as Trappistines. To generate income, most Trappist monasteries produce artisanal goods, the most famous of which is Trappist beer.

Armand-Jean Le Bouthillier de Rancé was a converted courtier who governed the Cistercian abbey of La Trappe in France and transformed it into a community that practiced extreme austerity of diet, penitential exercises, and absolute silence. He became its regular abbot in 1664 and, for more than 30 years, kept the abbey under his forceful sway.

In 1792 the monks were ejected from La Trappe, and a number of them, led by Dom Augustine de Lestrange, settled at Val-Sainte in Fribourg, Switzerland, where they adopted an even more rigid life and made several foundations before their expulsion in 1798. Long years of wandering in Russia and Germany were followed in 1814 by a return to La Trappe; they were the first religious order to revive after the French Revolution and, at the death of Lestrange in 1827, numbered 700. By the late 20th century there were abbeys worldwide, including several in England, Scotland, Canada, the United States, Australia, and South Africa. The three existing congregations of Trappists were united by Pope Leo XIII and became the independent Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance. They follow the primitive custom of Cîteaux, with an emphasis on silence and austerity but without the rigid regulations of the early Trappists. After World War II their growth was particularly notable in France and the United States.

Originally named Pep Auto Supply Company, the Company was founded in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1921 by Emanuel (Manny) Rosenfeld, Maurice L. (Moe) Strauss, W. Graham (Jack) Jackson, and Moe Radavitz.

Headquartered in the Philadelphia neighborhood of East Falls, Pep Boys provides name-brand tires, automotive maintenance and repair, parts and expert advice for the do-it-yourselfer, commercial auto parts delivery, and fleet maintenance and repair to customers across the U.S. with Just Brakes, its wholly owned subsidiary. Pep Boys operates more than 8,300 service bays in over 930 locations in 35 states and Puerto Rico.

Highlights from 1951-1954...

C.L. and Mollie Carter are the members with a car during these years. They have a 1953 Chevy Pickup.

The 1950-52 models were the last of the traditional low cost, low-suds Chevys, though DeLuxes accounted for 80-85 percent of production. The old 216.5 Stovebolt was coaxed up to 92-bhp in 1950 when a new 195-bhp 235.5-cid version arrived for cars equipped with optional two-speed Powerglide. Powerglide was Chevy's new fully automatic transmission, thus beating Ford whose Ford-O-Matic was still a year off, and Plymouth, which wouldn't have a true self-shifter until '55. Chevy took a breather the next two years, with no mechanical developments and only bulkier sheet metal for '51, followed by detail trim revisions for '52. The big news for Chevy during this time frame was the introduction of the Corvette sports car in 1953. The Corvette debuted in January 1953 and made 315 units that year with most reserved for promotion and favored VIP's. (Information adapted from The Encyclopedia of American Cars.)
